IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

April 29, 1921.

Mr. Good submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and ordered to be printed.

RESOLUTION.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this
2 resolution it shall be in order to take from the Speaker's
3 table the bill (S. 1084) entitled "An Act to provide for a
4 national budget system and an independent audit of Gov-
5 ernment accounts, and for other purposes," and to move that
6 the House resolve itself into the Committee of the Whole
7 House on the state of the Union for the consideration of
8 such bill. After general debate, which shall continue for not
9 to exceed two hours (one-half to be controlled by the gen-
10 tleman from Iowa (Mr. Good) and one-half by the gentle-
11 man from Tennessee (Mr. Byrns)), the text of the bill
12 (H. R. 30, Union Calendar No. 7) entitled "A bill to pro-
13 vide a national budget system and an independent audit of
14 Government accounts, and for other purposes," when offered
15 as a substitute for such Senate bill, shall be read for amend-
16 ment under the five-minute rule and considered as an original

1 bill in lieu of the text of such Senate bill. At the conclusion
2 of such consideration the committee shall rise and report such
3 Senate bill to the House with such amendments as may have
4 been adopted, whereupon the previous question shall be con-
5 sidered as ordered on the bill and any amendments thereto to
6 final passage without intervening motion, except one motion
7 to recommit.
