CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Revising the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal year 1983 and setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1984, 1985, and 1986.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That the Congress hereby determines and de-
3 clares that the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal
4 year 1983 is revised, the first concurrent resolution on the
5 budget for fiscal year 1984 is established, and the appropriate

15 that to attain the policy of this resolution in future fiscal

6 Budget shall report to the House a reconciliation bill incorpo-
7 rating all such recommendations without any substantive re-

2 SEC. 4. No bill or resolution providing new discretion-
3 ary budget authority for fiscal year 1984, or new spending
4 authority described in section 401(c)(2)(C) of the Congres-
5 sional Budget Act for fiscal year 1984, which exceeds the
6 appropriate allocation of such new discretionary budget au-
7 thority or new spending authority made pursuant to section
8 302(a) of such Act shall be enrolled until after the Congress
9 has completed action on the second concurrent resolution on
10 the budget required to be reported under section 310 of such
11 Act or until October 1, 1983, whichever occurs first.

12 SEC. 5. (a) If Congress has not completed action by
13 October 1, 1983, on the concurrent resolution on the budget
14 required to be reported under section 310(a) of the Budget
15 Act for the 1984 fiscal year, then this concurrent resolution
16 shall be deemed to be the concurrent resolution required to
17 be reported under section 310(a) of such Act, for the pur-
18 poses of section 311 of such Act: *Provided, however,* That if
19 Congress has not completed action by such date on the con-
20 current resolution required to be reported under section
21 310(a) of such Act for the 1984 fiscal year the Committee on
22 the Budget may report to the House a House or concurrent
23 resolution which only revises, for purposes of section 311 of
24 such Act, the levels of total budget outlays, budget authority,
25 and revenues for technical and economic assumptions.

1 (b) The report on such resolution to the House, in the
2 case of a House resolution, or the conference report, in the
3 case of a concurrent resolution, shall contain a statement al-
4 locating total new budget authority and total outlays to each
5 committee of the House, and said statement shall be deemed
6 to be the statement under section 302(a) of the Congressional
7 Budget Act.

8 (c) Section 311(a) of the Congressional Budget Act, as
9 made applicable by subsection (a) of this section, shall not
10 apply to bills, resolutions, or amendments within the jurisdic-
11 tion of a committee, or any conference report on any such bill
12 or resolution, if—

13 (1) the enactment of such bill or resolution as re-
14 ported;

15 (2) the adoption and enactment of such amend-
16 ment; or

17 (3) the enactment of such bill or resolution in the
18 form recommended in such conference report;

19 would not cause the appropriate allocation for such commit-
20 tee of new discretionary budget authority or new spending
21 authority as described in section 401(c)(2)(C) of the Congres-
22 sional Budget Act made pursuant to section 302(a) of such
23 Act for fiscal year 1984 to be exceeded.

24 (d) The provisions of this section shall cease to apply
25 when Congress completes action on a subsequent concurrent

1 resolution on the budget for fiscal year 1984 pursuant to sec-
2 tion 304 or 310 of the Congressional Budget Act.

3 SEC. 6. It is the sense of the Congress that monetary
4 policy and the economic assumptions in the budget resolution
5 shall be consistent with each other. To that end, it is the
6 sense of the Congress that in the reports to Congress re-
7 quired by the Full Employment and Balanced Growth Act of
8 1978, the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve
9 System shall report to the Congress on the objectives of the
10 Board of Governors and the Federal Open Market Committee
11 with respect to the growth or diminution of gross national
12 product in current and constant dollars, inflation, and unem-
13 ployment for the current and three following calendar years.
14 In addition, the Board shall in the same report explain the
15 differences, if any, between these objectives and the economic
16 assumptions of the most recent President's budget submis-
17 sion, the most recent projections of the Congressional Budget
18 Office, and the economic assumptions of the most recent con-
19 gressional budget resolution. It is further the sense of the
20 Congress that, if necessary, the Committee on Banking, Fi-
21 nance and Urban Affairs of the House of Representatives and
22 the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of
23 the Senate shall report legislation amending the Federal Re-
24 serve Act to require such reporting.

1 SEC. 7. It is the sense of the Congress that, in light of
2 budget restraint, limited resources, and the need to foster
3 economic growth, the House Committee on Armed Services
4 should initiate a thorough review of military retirement pro-
5 grams which constitute a major sector of the defense budget
6 and should recommend changes which would result in re-
7 duced spending under these programs.
