Mr. BOLLING, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 115) revising the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal year 1981 and setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1982, 1983, and 1984.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution it shall be in order to move that the House resolve
3 itself into the Committee of the Whole House on the State of

1 the Union for the consideration of the concurrent resolution
2 (H. Con. Res. 115) revising the congressional budget for the
3 United States Government for the fiscal year 1981 and set-
4 ting forth the congressional budget for the United States
5 Government for the fiscal years 1982, 1983, and 1984, and
6 the first reading of the resolution shall be dispensed with.
7 The provisions of subsection 305(a) of the Congressional
8 Budget Act of 1974 and rule XXIII, clause 8, of the Rules
9 of the House of Representatives shall apply during the con-
10 sideration of the concurrent resolution in the House and in
11 the Committee of the Whole: *Provided, however,* That no
12 amendment to the resolution shall be in order except the fol-
13 lowing amendments, which shall be considered only in the
14 following order if offered, which shall all be in order even if
15 previous amendments to the same portion of the concurrent
16 resolution have been adopted, and which shall not be subject
17 to amendment except pro forma amendments for the purpose
18 of debate: (1) an amendment printed in the Congressional
19 Record of April 29, 1981, by, and if offered by, Representa-
20 tive Hefner of North Carolina; (2) the amendment in the
21 nature of a substitute printed in the Congressional Record of
22 April 29, 1981, by, and if offered by, Delegate Fauntroy of
23 the District of Columbia; (3) the amendment in the nature of
24 a substitute printed in the Congressional Record of April 29,
25 1981, by, and if offered by, Representative Obey of Wiscon-

1 sin; and (4) the amendment in the nature of a substitute
2 printed in the Congressional Record of April 29, 1981, by,
3 and if offered by, Representative Latta of Ohio. It shall also
4 be in order to consider the amendment or amendments pro-
5 vided for in section 305(a)(6) of the Congressional Budget
6 Act of 1974 necessary to achieve mathematical consistency.
7 If more than one of the amendments in the nature of a substi-
8 tute made in order by this resolution have been adopted, only
9 the last such amendment which has been adopted shall be
10 considered as having been finally adopted and reported back
11 to the House.
