CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1981, 1982, and 1983 and revising the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal year 1980.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring), That the Congress hereby determines and de-*
3 *clares, pursuant to section 301(a) of the Congressional*

1 Budget Act of 1974, that for the fiscal year beginning on
2 October 1, 1980—

3 (1) the recommended level of Federal revenues is
4 \$613,800,000,000, and the amount by which the ag-
5 gregate level of Federal revenues should be decreased
6 is \$10,300,000,000 and the amount by which the ag-
7 gregate level of Federal revenues should be increased
8 is \$22,300,000,000;

9 (2) the appropriate level of total budget authority
10 is \$694,600,000,000;

11 (3) the appropriate level of total budget outlays is
12 \$611,800,000,000;

13 (4) the amount of the surplus in the budget which
14 is appropriate in the light of economic conditions and
15 all other relevant factors is \$2,000,000,000;

16 (5) the appropriate level of the public debt is
17 \$926,800,000,000 and the amount by which the statu-
18 tory limit on such debt should accordingly be increased
19 is \$30,100,000,000; and

20 (6) the appropriate level of total gross obligations
21 for the principal amount of direct loans is
22 \$60,600,000,000 and the appropriate level of total
23 commitments to guarantee loan principal is
24 \$79,600,000,000.

1 SEC. 2. Based on allocations of the appropriate level of
2 total new budget authority and of total budget outlays as set
3 forth in paragraphs (2) and (3) of the first section of this
4 resolution, the Congress hereby determines and declares pur-
5 suant to section 301(a)(2) of the Congressional Budget Act of
6 1974 that for the fiscal year beginning on October 1, 1980,
7 the appropriate level of new budget outlays authority and the
8 estimated budget outlays for each major functional category

5 instructed to report on or before June 15, 1980, such
6 recommendations to effectuate reductions in corre-
7 sponding new budget authority for fiscal year 1981,
8 budget authority initially provided for prior fiscal years,
9 and new or existing spending authority for programs
10 within the jurisdiction of those committees;

11 (2) the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutri-
12 tion, and Forestry shall reduce spending for fiscal year

2 15, 1980, such recommendations to effectuate reduc-
3 tions in corresponding outlays for programs within the
4 jurisdiction of those committees;

6 Transportation shall reduce spending for fiscal year
7 1981 in enacted laws, bills, and resolutions by
8 \$150,000,000 in budget authority and \$150,000,000
9 in outlays and is instructed to report on or before June

6 (j) the Senate Committee on Finance shall reduce
7 spending for fiscal year 1981 in enacted laws, bills,
8 and resolutions by \$917,000,000 in budget authority
9 and \$2,069,000,000 in outlays and is instructed to
10 report on or before June 15, 1980, its recommenda-
11 tions for changes in new budget authority for fiscal
12 year 1981, budget authority initially provided for prior
13 fiscal years, and new or existing spending authority
14 contained in enacted laws, bills, and resolutions within
15 the jurisdiction of this committee sufficient to accom-

14 SEC. 4. In accordance with section 301(b)(1) of the
15 Budget Act, no bill or resolution providing new budget au-
16 thority for fiscal year 1981 or providing new or existing
17 spending authority described in section 401(c)(2)(C) of the
18 Budget Act in excess of the allocation of the appropriate
19 levels of total budget outlays and total new budget authority
20 submitted pursuant to section 302(b) of the Budget Act, shall
21 be enrolled until Congress has completed action on the
22 second budget resolution for that fiscal year as required to be
23 reported under section 310 of the Budget Act; and, if a rec-
24 onciliation bill or reconciliation resolution, or both, are re-

1 quired to be reported under section 310(c), until Congress
2 has completed action on that bill or resolution, or both.
