CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That the Congress hereby determines and de-
3 clares, pursuant to section 301(a) of the Congressional
4 Budget Act of 1974, that for the fiscal year beginning on
5 October 1, 1980—

6 (1) the recommended level of Federal revenues is
7 \$613,800,000,000, and the amount by which the ag-
8 gregate level of Federal revenues should be decreased
9 is \$10,300,000,000 and the amount by which the ag-
10 aggregate level of Federal revenues should be increased
11 is \$4,300,000,000;

1 (2) the appropriate level of total budget authority
2 is \$694,600,000,000;

3 (3) the appropriate level of total budget outlays is
4 \$611,800,000,000;

5 (4) the amount of the surplus in the budget which
6 is appropriate in the light of economic conditions and
7 all other relevant factors is \$2,000,000,000;

8 (5) the appropriate level of the public debt is
9 \$926,800,000,000 and the amount by which the statu-
10 tory limit on such debt should accordingly be increased
11 is \$30,100,000,000; and

12 (6) the appropriate level of total gross obligations
13 for the principal amount of direct loans is
14 \$60,600,000,000 and the appropriate level of total
15 commitments to guarantee loan principal is
16 \$79,600,000,000.

17 SEC. 2. Based on allocations of the appropriate level of
18 total new budget authority and of total budget outlays as set
19 forth in paragraphs (2) and (3) of the first section of this
20 resolution, the Congress hereby determines and declares pur-
21 suant to section 301(a)(2) of the Congressional Budget Act of
22 1974 that for the fiscal year beginning on October 1, 1980,
23 the appropriate level of new budget outlays authority and the
24 estimated budget outlays for each major functional category

14 Budget Act:

16 the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and
17 Forestry shall recommend program reductions for fiscal
18 year 1981 in reported or enacted laws, bills, and reso-
19 lutions that reduce spending by \$520,000,000 in
20 budget authority and \$520,000,000 in outlays and are
21 instructed to report on or before June 15, 1980, such
22 recommendations to effectuate reductions in corre-
23 sponding new budget authority for fiscal year 1981,
24 budget authority initially provided for prior fiscal years,

1 and new or existing spending authority for programs
2 within the jurisdiction of those committees;

3 (2) the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutri-
4 tion, and Forestry shall reduce spending for fiscal year
5 1981 in enacted laws, bills, and resolutions by
6 \$533,000,000 in budget authority, and \$507,000,000
7 in outlays and is instructed to report on or before June
8 15, 1980, its recommendations for changes in new
9 budget authority for fiscal year 1981, budget authority

5 in budget authority and \$4,204,000,000 in outlays and
6 are instructed to report on or before June 15, 1980,
7 their recommendations for changes in new budget au-
8 thority for fiscal year 1981, budget authority initially
9 provided for prior fiscal years, and new or existing
10 spending authority contained in enacted laws, bills, and
11 resolutions within the jurisdictions of those committees
12 sufficient to accomplish the reduction required by this
13 subsection;

14 (f)(1) the House Committee on Public Works and
15 Transportation and the Senate Committee on Environ-
16 ment and Public Works shall recommend program re-
17 ductions for fiscal year 1981 in enacted laws, bills, and
18 resolutions that reduce spending by \$400,000,000 in
19 outlays and are instructed to report on or before June
20 15, 1980, such recommendations to effectuate reduc-
21 tions in corresponding outlays for programs within the
22 jurisdiction of those committees;

23 (2) the House Committee on Public Works and
24 Transportation shall reduce spending for fiscal year
25 1981 in enacted laws, bills, and resolutions by

1 \$150,000,000 in budget authority and \$150,000,000
2 in outlays and is instructed to report on or before June
3 15, 1980, its recommendations for changes in new
4 budget authority for fiscal year 1981, budget authority
5 initially provided for prior fiscal years, and new or ex-
6 isting spending authority contained in reported or en-
7 acted laws, bills, and resolutions within the jurisdiction
8 of this committee sufficient to accomplish the reduction

20 and new or existing spending authority contained in
21 enacted laws, bills, and resolutions within the jurisdic-
22 tions of those committees, or for programs within the
23 jurisdictions of those committees, sufficient to accom-
24 plish the reduction required by this subsection;

1 (h) the House Committee on Ways and Means
2 shall reduce spending for fiscal year 1981 in reported
3 or enacted laws, bills, and resolutions by \$717,000,000
4 in budget authority and \$1,869,000,000 in outlays,
5 and is instructed to report on or before June 15, 1980,
6 its recommendations for changes in new budget author-
7 ity for fiscal year 1981, budget authority initially pro-
8 vided for prior fiscal years, and new or existing spend-
9 ing authority contained in reported or enacted laws,

6 tions for changes in new budget authority for fiscal
7 year 1981, budget authority initially provided for prior
8 fiscal years, and new or existing spending authority
9 contained in enacted laws, bills, and resolutions within

9 SEC. 4. In accordance with section 301(b)(1) of the
10 Budget Act, no bill or resolution providing new budget au-
11 thority for fiscal year 1981 or providing new or existing
12 spending authority described in section 401(c)(2)(C) of the
13 Budget Act in excess of the allocation of the appropriate
14 levels of total budget outlays and total new budget authority
15 submitted pursuant to section 302(b) of the Budget Act, shall
16 be enrolled until Congress has completed action on the
17 second budget resolution for that fiscal year as required to be
18 reported under section 310 of the Budget Act; and, if a rec-
19 onciliation bill or reconciliation resolution, or both, are re-
20 quired to be reported under section 310(c), until Congress
21 has completed action on that bill or resolution, or both.
