## RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 307) setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1981, 1982, and 1983 and revising the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal year 1980.

1        *Resolved*, That during the consideration of the concur-  
2        rent resolution (H. Con. Res. 307) setting forth the congres-  
3        sional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal  
4        years 1981, and 1982, and 1983 and revising the congres-  
5        sional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal

1 year 1980, in the Committee of the Whole House on the  
2 State of the Union, no amendments to the concurrent resolu-  
3 tion shall be in order except the following amendments,  
4 which shall be considered only in the following order, and  
5 shall all be in order even if previous amendments to the same  
6 portion of the concurrent resolution have been adopted, and  
7 which shall not be subject to amendment except pro forma  
8 amendments for the purpose of debate and except as provided  
9 in this resolution: (1) an amendment printed in the Congres-  
10 sional Record of April 21, 1980, by, and if offered by, Repre-  
11 sentative Giaimo of Connecticut, which shall not be subject  
12 to a demand for a division of the question in the House or in  
13 Committee of the Whole; (2) an amendment printed in the  
14 Congressional Record of April 21, 1980, by, and if offered  
15 by, Representative Conable of New York, which shall be  
16 subject to amendment by a substitute printed in the Congres-  
17 sional Record of April 21, 1980, by, and if offered by, Repre-  
18 sentative Quillen of Tennessee, and said substitute shall not  
19 be subject to amendment except pro forma amendments for  
20 the purpose of debate; (3) an amendment in the nature of a  
21 substitute printed in the Congressional Record of April 21,  
22 1980, by, and if offered by, Representative Obey of Wiscon-  
23 sin, which shall be subject to amendment by the following  
24 substitutes which shall be considered only in the following  
25 order and shall not be subject to amendment except pro

1 forma amendments for the purpose of debate; (a) a substitute  
2 printed in the Congressional Record of April 21, 1980, by,  
3 and if offered by, Representative Mitchell of Maryland, and  
4 (b) a substitute printed in the Congressional Record of April  
5 21, 1980, by, and if offered by, Representative Solarz of  
6 New York; (4) an amendment in the nature of a substitute  
7 printed in the Congressional Record of April 21, 1980, by,  
8 and if offered by, Representative Ottinger of New York; (5)  
9 an amendment in the nature of a substitute printed in the  
10 Congressional Record of April 21, 1980, by, and if offered  
11 by, Representative Holt of Maryland; (6) an amendment in  
12 the nature of a substitute printed in the Congressional  
13 Record of April 21, 1980, by, and if offered by, Representa-  
14 tive Latta of Ohio; (7) an amendment in the nature of a sub-  
15 stitute printed in the Congressional Record of April 21,  
16 1980, by, and if offered by, Representative Rousselot of  
17 California; and (8) a motion to strike section 3 of the concur-  
18 rent resolution, or the corresponding section of the concur-  
19 rent resolution as amended, relating to reconciliation. It shall  
20 also be in order to consider the amendment or amendments  
21 provided for in section 305(a)(6) of the Congressional Budget  
22 Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-344) necessary to achieve  
23 mathematical consistency. If more than one of the amend-  
24 ments in the nature of a substitute made in order by this  
25 resolution has been adopted, only the last such amendment

1 which has been adopted shall be considered as having been  
2 finally adopted and reported back to the House.

3       **SEC. 2.** Notwithstanding the provisions of section 203  
4 of Public Law 96-78, the provisions of section 201 of said  
5 public law, amending the Rules of the House of Representa-  
6 tives to establish the public debt limit as part of the congres-  
7 sional budget process, shall apply with respect to section 6 of  
8 H. Con. Res. 307 or the corresponding section of any con-  
9 current resolution as finally adopted revising the second con-  
10 current resolution on the budget for fiscal year 1980, as well  
11 as to section 1 of H. Con. Res. 307 or the corresponding  
12 section of any concurrent resolution as finally adopted, set-  
13 ting forth the congressional budget for the fiscal year 1981.
