Section 13208(b) of the Budget Enforcement Act added this final expiration, beginning with "and (E)." See infra p. 729. This addition made more sense in the format of subsection (b) as it existed before enactment of the Budget Enforcement Act (see infra this note), but Congress clearly intended that the sentences referred to expire at the same time as part C of Gramm-Rudman-Hollings.

The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 extended the sequestration enforcement of the discretionary spending limits and pay-as-you-go system through 1998. The Act did not extend beyond 1995 the deficit target sequestration enforcement or most of the 60-vote points of order in the Senate. Section 14002(c)(3)(A) of that Act provides:

(3) EXPIRATION. — (A) Notwithstanding section 275(b) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, sections 250, 251, 252, and 254 through 258C of that Act shall expire on September 30, 1998

Senate Amendment
