§ 4(a)(2) (2) that outlays¹⁸⁸² for direct spending¹⁸⁸³ for the current¹⁸⁸⁴ or budget year¹⁸⁸⁵ are projected to exceed the applicable direct spending targets,¹⁸⁸⁶ the Director¹⁸⁸⁷ shall include in the budget¹⁸⁸⁸ a special direct spending message meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this Section.
