SEC. 10121. AMENDMENTS TO SECTIONS 1022 AND 1024.

[2 USC 691a.](#)

(a) SECTION 1022.—Section 1022(b)(1)(F) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amended by striking “section 601” and inserting “section 251(c) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985”.

[2 USC 691c.](#)

(b) SECTION 1024.—Section 1024(a)(1)(B) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amended by striking “section 601(a)(2)” and inserting “section 251(c) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985”.

22. Amendments to sections 1022 and 1024 of the Congressional Budget Act

HOUSE BILL (SECTION 11119)

The House bill makes conforming changes to sections 1022 and 1024 of the Line Item Veto Act reflecting the repeal of section 601 of the Budget Act and its incorporation into section 251(c) of GRH.

SENATE AMENDMENT (SECTION 1616)

The language in the Senate Amendment is identical to the House Bill.

CONFERENCE AGREEMENT (SECTION 10121)

The Senate recedes to the House.

COUNSEL NOTES

Section 10121 (BEA 1997) amended the Line Item Veto Act of 1996, which comprised Part C of Title X of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974. Under section 5 of the Line Item Act, which added Part C to Title X, the Act has expired:

Effective and Termination Dates

Pub. L. 104–130, §5, Apr. 9, 1996, 110 Stat. 1212, provided that: “This Act [the Line Item Veto Act] and the amendments made by it shall take effect and apply to measures enacted on the earlier of—

“(1) the day after the enactment into law, pursuant to Article I, section 7, of the Constitution of the United States, of an Act entitled ‘An Act to provide for a seven-year plan for deficit reduction and achieve a balanced Federal budget.’; or

“(2) January 1, 1997;
and shall have no force or effect on or after January 1, 2005.”

Short Title of the Line Item Veto Act

The “Line Item Veto Act” is the short title of [Pub. L. 104-130, §5, Apr. 9, 1996, 110 Stat. 1212](#), which added Part C to Title X of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974. This “Part C” of the title that was added has the short title of the “Line Item Veto Act of 1996”. Hence the Public Law has a different short title than the Part it added to existing law.
